## PBCDF Operations

### Chemical Weapons Eliminated:

- Weekly Total: 1,053 Nerve Agent GB Rockets
- Project Total: 2,440 Nerve Agent GB Rockets

### Nerve Agent GB Eliminated (Liquid Incinerator):

- Weekly Total: 11,274 pounds
- Project Total: 18,001 pounds



Deactivation Furnace

The first demilitarization project at Pine Bluff Arsenal was completed in June 1990 with the successful incineration of chemical weapons containing BZ, a non-lethal hallucinating agent. More than 150,000 munitions items were safely processed in the deactivation furnace system.

### PBCDF Milestone Dates:

- Chemical Weapons Stockpile Storage began 1945
- Construction began 1999
- Construction complete 2002
- Testing and Training complete 2005
- Disposal Operations began March 2005
