

TOCDF Update

The first mustard agent-filled munition punched and drained on Aug. 18 signaled the beginning of the last major destruction campaign at the U.S. Army's Tooele Chemical Agent Disposal Facility at Deseret Chemical Depot (DCD).

"Our workforce is proud to be a part of this legacy," said Col. Frederick Pellissier, DCD commander, "and we are committed to working towards creating a safer tomorrow for this great nation."

There are nearly 6,194 tons of mustard agent stored mostly in bulk containers at DCD. This is the largest chemical agent destruction campaign that the Army will undertake to eliminate aging stockpiles and meet the nation's commitment under the global Chemical Weapons Convention. The event coincides with the 10th anniversary of the start of operations at the facility.

The Tooele Chemical Agent Disposal Facility is safely destroying the stockpile of chemical weapons stored at Deseret Chemical Depot, while ensuring maximum protection for our workers, our community and our environment.
